It doesn't take much. This goes in the grand lodge report which keeps our nonprofit status and helps us lobby for support when needed. These same calculations are used for any volunteering activities we do. We do the same reporting for every volunteer project or event. A little goes a long way. We each can contribute in our own way, whatever works for you. **THANK YOU AGAIN for everyone pulling together to work together as a TEAM and for understanding and helping out when needed without complaint, and for everyone helping in their own way and coming forth and volunteering and coming forth with new ideas**. You all have been terrific.

The RITUAL is at the heart of elkdom. It is how we initiate our new members and how we educate and impress them about what Elkdom spirit is and that for which Elks stand. It encompasses the heart (charity, justice, brotherly love and fidelity), the principles by which we as Elks live. We also go to contest for the district, the state and Nationally with our ritual.
