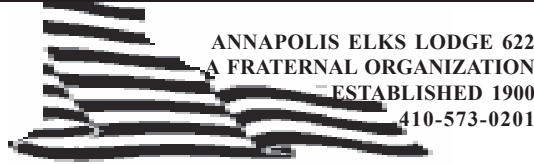

Maryland to study elk reintroduction

ANNAPOLIS — Maryland is home to Elkton and Elkridge, but elk haven't roamed the state since the 1700s.

However, that could soon change. The Department of Natural Resources says it is forming a partnership with the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation and the Maryland Legislative Sportsmen's Foundation to study reintroduction of the species to western Maryland.

The study will take at least a year and look at the biological, social and economic feasibility of elk reintroduction. The assessment will include contacting farmers and others who might be affected, as well as studying potential elk habitat.

Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation President and CEO David Allen says there is no higher calling in conservation than restoring a species to an area where it had once been, but citizens must support the effort.

Once again April 1st has come and gone, and we are almost half way through the current lodge year and by this time each of our Members should have paid dues for the 2011/2012 lodge year. But that would be a Miracle. As of this writing we still have 95 members who have NOT PAID current dues, which adds up to \$11,115.00 of budgeted income that is needed for the smooth operation of the lodge. As of October 1st all unpaid dues members will be considered as 1 year delinquents, and if dues are not paid in full prior to March 31, 2012, they must be dropped from the membership rolls for non-payment, which none of us want to happen! Also, as of October 1st, I will be required to post all delinquents in the monthly bulletin, and I am sure you will not want to see your name on that list!

If you are one of those who has forgotten to pay dues, please remit your check ASAP, by completing the enclosed Dues Renewal Form & sending same to me with your check made payable to BPO Elks #622, (please be sure to include your member number on the form or your check). Also be reminded that dues are \$117.00 for regular members, and \$37.00 or \$47.00 for those who have been elected to life membership (pending on the results of the ballot on the proposed By-Law changes) which will be balloted on Sept. 7 meeting, which includes Grand Lodge and State Association dues and fees.

REMEMBER Only Members in Good Standing are entitled to Privileges of the Lodge, or its facilities, and delinquent members are not permitted in the lodge as the guest of a Member in Good Standing!!
